PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

LOCKDOWN PRACTICE

As part of our Health and Safety Procedures at Kio Kio School, we are required to practise fire, lockdown and earthquake drills.

We have already had a fire drill practice which went really well with all students and staff assembled on our top field and the roll taken within 7 minutes.

We will be holding a lockdown practice either tomorrow (Friday) or late next week. Staff have been going over the procedures with their students in preparation for this drill.

If there is a threat to student and staff safety, Kio Kio School may follow procedures for a lockdown or shelter in place. This usually means we move everyone at the school indoors and we remain there until the "all clear" is given. Our actions may differ on the depending situation. recommendations from authorities.

A lockdown or shelter in place may be signalled by the principal or their delegate, and authorities such as the New Zealand Police. We practise our lockdown and shelter in place procedures regularly with staff and students (as appropriate).

STRUCTURED LITERACY INFORMATION EVENING


