POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING SCHOOL WIDE (PB4L - SW)

Our whole school staff had a holiday meeting to discuss our Positive Behaviour for Learning Plan and behaviour expectations for our students. Our expectations are based around the POWER Values and are unique to the different settings within our school. For example: class, library, playground, rec centre.

Please find attached to this newsletter:

- Behaviour Flowchart / Plan - staff will use this chart to identify the behaviour a child is displaying and will then determine the next steps / course of action to be taken.
- All School Settings Expectations - These expectations are based around the POWER Values. We will be displaying the expectations for areas within our school for everyone to see. Initially, these will be laminated with the intention of having the signs professionally made once we have adopted them fully.

Thank you to the PB4L team who have been attending professional learning days with the Ministry of Education over the last year and a half, and to the staff and community who have helped with our POWER Values and designing the Behaviour Flow Chart and Expectations for our students.

A huge thank you to Stacey Reynolds for the work she has done, especially developing our

behaviour plans moving forward and leading our holiday meeting to share this work.

At the PB4L days run by the Ministry, schools have shared their own plans with each other, so we have used some of these to help develop our plans. Recently, Ohaupo School shared theirs with us, so we are appreciative of this collaborative help.

INTERNET USE

At school we use a company called Linewize to manage our Internet traffic and safety for our students. As the principal, I receive notifications from this company if a student has entered a search or is attempting to go onto sites which have inappropriate content. The message I receive will give me the student's name, the time and search message that the student has written. Any Internet websites with inappropriate content will be blocked at this stage. I will then meet with the student and inform the teacher as to the outcome once I have decided whether it was a deliberate attempt to search or not. If necessary, families will be informed and a course of action may be taken.

It is imperative that students are safe at all times. However, we have no control over students using the Internet at home. Linewize has an area on their website for families to use. They have excellent free or paid plans for families, which can provide controls over your child's internet access and content they are allowed to receive. You will be able to receive a message if the search content is inappropriate.

You can protect and manage every device that connects to your home WiFi, including smart TVs, gaming consoles, PCs and even guest devices.

Please check out this website if you feel that you are not sure what your child is viewing on their devices at home. From as little as \$69 for the year, you will get peace of mind knowing that your child is safe from harm. Here is the link to the Linewize website:

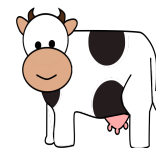

POLICE RAINBOWS END FUN TRIP

SATURDAY 11 SEPTEMBER 2021

As in previous years this event has been organised by the Police Bluelight branch at Otara and will be attended by a large group of students from all over the North Island. The trip is open to Year 6, 7 and 8 students from all local schools including rural. The students will be well supervised by local Police Staff/adult volunteers and senior students.

On Saturday 11 September a bus will be leaving the Piopio Police Station at 7:15am and will return approx 6:30pm, the second bus will leave the Te Kuiti Police Station at 7:30am and will return at approx 6pm. The third bus will be leaving the Otorohanga Police Station at 7:45am, returning approx 6pm.

The total cost to the children is \$60.00 and that includes the bus and entry fee to Rainbows End. Police are providing an all-day sausage sizzle and cordial service at no extra cost. It is **NOT** envisaged that the bus will stop either going to or from Rainbows End, except for toilet breaks. It would be wise for the students to bring a bag with a drink and a light snack for the journeys. A change of clothes, sun hat and raincoat are also recommended.

Numbers are restricted due to bus sizes and seats required for travelling supervisors. Allocations will be:

- Piopio - Money and slips to Piopio College
- Te Kuiti - Money and slips to Te Kuiti Police Station
- Otorohanga - Money and slips to Otorohanga Police Station
- Bank deposit to Youth Activity Account

Money with completed permission slips will confirm attendance, based on first in, first served.
